Children's Wet Sponge Competition

The Children's Wet Sponge Competition can be entered by anyone 16 or under. All contestants will need to register to take part.

The contestant scoring the most points will be declared the winner.

The Rules

- 4 human targets will sit 2 meters from the throwing line.
- Each contestant will have 5 sponges to throw.
- Sponges to be thrown with the left hand only
- Contestants to commence throwing on the order "READY STEADY SPONGE!"
- Points will be awarded for direct hits and near misses as follows.
 - 6 points for a direct hit (must hit squarely in the face)
 - 3 points for near miss (must be shoulder height upwards)
 - 1 point for the sponge hitting any other part of the body.
 - Two consecutive misses and the contestant forfeits 1 point.



Competition Rules

- Each contestant should be 8ft 3¼in from the target. Inspected and approved by an official expert as the correct throwing distance.
- Pies should measure no more than 26cm in diameter or 2.47cm in depth.
- Pies can only be thrown with the left hand.
- Pies should be held flat on the palm of the hand.
- The pies should not be raised above shoulder height.
- Points will be awarded for direct hits and near misses as follows.
 - 6 points for a direct hit (must hit squarely in the face)
 - 3 points for near miss (must be shoulder height upwards)
 - 1 point for the pie hitting any other part of the body.
 - Two consecutive misses and the team forfeits 1 point.
- On no account must any team member be in possession of more than 3 pies.
- Targets may avoid pies but should not move more than one step in any direction or a distance greater than 3ft 2in.
- At no time should any pie be a greater distance from the ground than that previously agreed with the judge. Account will be taken of wind velocity, danger to onlookers and the general fitness of the contestants to cope with pies flying at high speeds.



Competition Rules

- No compensations can be awarded to any onlooker who is either deliberately or accidentally daubed with a quantity of pie filling, unless this should exceed the average quantity of custard eaten per head in the year 1987.
- Teams drawn to compete against each other will act as their own human targets.
- Judges well versed in the art of custard pie throwing will award points for direct hits etc as in rule 6, and for the most amusing and original method of attack.
- Special marks will be awarded by the judges for dress, maximum 6 points when the team's parade for the championship.
- Must be in fancy dress.
- The organisers may restrict the right arm, above the elbow, to prevent defensive action against a direct hit.

Number of pies per round:

Round 1 & 2: 5 pies each (20 total)

Semi Final: 7 pies each (28 total)

Final: 10 pies each (40 total)
